


Grading by Question

Here's the scenario...

You made a mistake when setting up a quiz question. You realized that you assigned the points to an incorrect answer, and you went into your question library and corrected it. The problem is that the students have already taken the quiz and you need to correct the grades. How can you do this without going in to each student's attempt and changing the grade for this question?

The answer is you can grade by question. Grading by question allows instructors to easily correct mistakes that may have occurred during the initial setup of quiz questions by simply overriding the original grades. Grades for all users can be overridden at once instead of individually updating each quiz attempt.

Here's how to do it..

1. Click the  *Grade Quiz* icon next to the quiz in question to enter the *Grade Quiz* screen.
2. You will see three tabs near the top of the screen with *Users* selected by default. Click the *Questions* tab to display a list of questions in the quiz.

3. Click on a question title to view statistics on and/or re-grade that question. The next page will display a percentage breakdown (question analysis) of how users responded to the question, and the date of the most recent response. Other information displayed in the analysis includes the quiz version, question text and options, and the number of responses for each option.
4. Select the grade icon on the right of the question to modify the grade for the current question,

and a *Grade* section will be added to the bottom of the *Grade Quiz* screen.

Modifications Log

Grading Type - provides two options:

- a. The *Give to all attempts* option allows you to award points to all users who received the current question on their quiz. Simply type the desired point value in the textbox.

Example: You found a bad question worth one point in your quiz and you want everyone to get credit for the question no matter what they answered. Use this option with a 1 in the points box.

- b. The *Give to attempts with answer (#)* option allows you to set a specific value for a specific response.

Example: A one point question was set up with B as the correct answer when it should have been C. Select *Give to attempts with answer* and choose 2 from the drop-down (B was the second choice), enter 0 in the *points* box, and click *Save*. This will remove the points from those who selected this incorrect answer.

Next, select *Give to attempts with answer* again and choose 3 from the drop-down (answer C) and enter 1 in the *points* box.

5. A *Comment* box is available to provide an explanatory notes to users.
6. Click *Save* when you have completed your changes.

Note: Each time you make a change and save the results, the *Modifications Log* at the bottom of the page will be updated to reflect the change.
