

Career & Technical Education Coordinator/LVEC Certification

UW-Stout has been granted permission to offer the Career and Technical Education Coordinator (formerly known as LVEC) Certification. This certification can be completed as part of a Master of Science Degree in Career and Technical Education or as an add-on to a master's degree in education or administration. If the CTE Coordinator program at Stout is complete, professionals will also receive the Education for Employment Coordinator and School-to-Work Coordinator certification when they apply for the DPI license. Certification requires a licensure in one of the Career and Technical Education areas, three years of teaching experience, submission of a portfolio and completion of CTE-502 Principles of Career and Technical Education. Courses are frequently offered online and on weekends at various sites across the state or on-campus.
